Nihonbashi Revitalization Plan's Two Projects Awarded the Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Minister's 2016 Land Use Model Award

Tokyo, Japan, November 7, 2016 Mitsui Fudosan Co., Ltd., a leading global real estate company headquartered in Tokyo, announced today that the Nihonbashi Muromachi East District Development Project and Nihonbashi-honcho 2-chome Redevelopment Project forming part of the Nihonbashi Revitalization Plan in which the Company is involved were awarded with the Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism Minister's Fiscal 2016 Land Use Model Awards, which is sponsored by the Institute for Future Urban Development.



Overview of the Nihonbashi-honcho 2-chome Redevelopment Project


