



AEA 2019 Innovation Awards Staged in the Kashiwa-no-ha Area
Pre-Event Held with Speakers from the Frontlines of Cutting-Edge Technology
— Latest Trends of Startups in Asia and Collaboration Expertise —
Date and venue: 13:00, Tuesday, July 30, 2019 at Tokyo Midtown Hibiya BaseQ

Tokyo, Japan, July 10, 2019 - Mitsui Fudosan Co., Ltd., a leading global real estate company headquartered in Tokyo, announced today that the Asian Entrepreneurship Award (AEA) Steering Committee decided to hold the Innovation Awards event AEA 2019 from Wednesday, October 30 to Friday, November 1, 2019 in the Kashiwa-no-ha area of Kashiwa, Chiba Prefecture. Before the awards, a pre-event will be held at Tokyo Midtown Hibiya BaseQ on Tuesday, July 30, 2019, providing an overview of AEA, latest trends of startups in Asia, and collaboration expertise.

AEA2019 will bring entrepreneurs and cutting-edge technologies from all over Asia to the Kashiwa-no-ha area and further accelerate the creation of an ecosystem for innovation and creativity in Asia that engages major corporations, entrepreneurs and their supporters in a collaboration between the public and private sectors and academia.



■AEA 2019 to Build an Ecosystem for Technology Startups

AEA is an innovation award program that attracts young entrepreneurs harnessing knowledge and technologies to take on new challenges from all over fast-growing Asia, with the goal of forming an ecosystem for generating innovation in Asia through collaboration between the public and private sectors and academia, from major corporations to supporters of entrepreneurs. AEA was first held in 2012 and in the seven events since then, 154 technology startups from 15 countries or territories in Asia have taken part. Participating companies have used AEA as a springboard for growth and global expansion by collaborating with Japanese companies and opening up new markets.

The Kashiwa-no-ha area focuses on utilizing local assets to attract field testing projects of new products and services in the social implementation stage supplied by private-sector companies and other organizations. AEA 2019 will provide test fields for startups taking part and further strengthen business support to accelerate the formation of an ecosystem in the Kashiwa-no-ha area for startups that create new industries and technologies. The event will showcase innovation originating in Asia to the world.

A social event Kashiwa-no-ha Innovation Fest (tentative name) will also be held in conjunction with AEA 2019, with the full backing of Mitsui Fudosan and other organizations driving the Kashiwa-no-ha Smart City project. Details will be announced once they are confirmed.

Applications Open for Startups Taking Part in AEA 2019

Companies participating in AEA will not only build connections with other technology startups and become part of a global accelerator network, but also receive business and field-testing support in the Kashiwa-no-ha area. Startups wishing to take part can apply if they fulfill the following conditions.

<Conditions for AEA 2019 Participants>

- (1) Technology companies that provide products or services
- (2) Early stage startups having completed proof of concept (POC) and able to communicate with a specific customer profile using prototypes, product samples, mockups, etc.
 - No restrictions on number of years since establishment or amount of capital
 - Venture-backed companies and those with VC involvement are eligible, but not listed companies.
 - Subsidiaries and affiliates of major companies are not eligible.
- (3) Companies with a specific interest in the Japanese market, such as tie-ups with major Japanese companies or VC
- (4) Companies recommended by venture business incubation managers of universities, research institutes, incubators, or accelerators
- (5) Companies able to take part in the entire program from October 30 – November 1, 2019

※ About the Kashiwa-no-ha area

The Kashiwa-no-ha area centered on Kashiwa-no-ha Campus Station aspires to be Kashiwa-no-ha Smart City, which solves urban issues. Its three main themes are “an environmentally symbiotic city,” “a city of health and longevity” and “a city of new industry creation,” and made possible through collaboration between the public and private sectors and academia. Kashiwa-no-ha IoT Business Co-Creation Lab was established in June 2018 to further the spread and use of IoT and create business opportunities for IoT-related businesses. The Lab has opened its doors to field testing projects in Kashiwa-no-ha for products and services of private-sector companies and others at the social implementation stage. This is part of Innovation Field Kashiwa-no-ha, a program to accelerate the creation of new industries. So far, more than 10 field tests are planned or have been performed. By making the entire city a platform for field testing, Kashiwa-no-ha Smart City will become an engine for new industries and innovation.

Led by Mitsui Fudosan and the Kashiwa municipal government, Kashiwa-no-ha Smart City Consortium was formed and designated a Smart City Model Project by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport, which promotes the creation of smart cities that incorporate new technologies such as AI and IoT and data held by the public and private sectors in neighborhood creation. Kashiwa-no-ha Smart City Consortium aims to form a data-driven, smart and compact city built around a rail station by building a data platform linking held by the public and private sectors.
